During his career, Delwin was a member of the Kansas National Education Association and the National Education Association. He was also a member of the Kansas Association of Teachers of Mathematics, and he served 3 terms on the Kansas Professional Teaching Practices Commission, serving as chair for one year. Delwin was a long time member of the First United Methodist Church, where, for a time, he served on numerous committees and taught Sunday School. Delwin was especially proud of his military service, his terms on the Professional Teaching Practices Commission, and his life-long service to public education. Outside of his career, he enjoyed playing bridge, watching football and basketball, and, most especially, fishing. In his final years, Delwin was a man with an easy smile and a chuckle, and he was grateful for the care he received at Maple Heights Nursing Home. He enjoyed the men's coffee time where old friends came to visit, and he was proud to represent residents on an advocates' council there.
