Delores was a member of the First Presbyterian Church where she served as a Sunday School Teacher, deacon, and elder and church choir member. In 1991, she was appointed as a board member of the local Selective Service System after completing training in Wichita, KS. Delores loved learning and took college courses in psychology, sociology, philosophy, and biology at local colleges.
