Florence M. Fischer, of Beattie, KS, died Friday, March 13, 2015 at Life Care Center in Seneca, KS.

Florence was born March 14, 1920 on the family farm near Clyde, KS, the eighth of thirteen children to Nicholas and Cordelia (Menard) Koch.
