## rural White Cloud, KS

Norris N. Loyd, 90, of rural White Cloud, died Monday morning, October 5, 2015, at the North Pines in Hiawatha, surrounded by his family.

Norris was born at Hiawatha, July 16, 1925, one of three sons born to Glenn and Hazel Bearce Loyd and had lived nearly all of his life in the Brown and Doniphan county area. He married Eva Sabbert, December 28, 1947, at the Zion Church. They farmed near White Cloud many years where they raised their family. Eva preceded him in death May 27, 1999. Norris was also preceded in death by his parents; bothers: Eugene and Donald; grandson Eric Blanton; two sons in law: William M. Blanton and Kenneth Christopher.
