He was often found at the local coffee shop engaged in lively discussion about one esoteric topic or another. He lived his life on his own terms and died in the best possible way, in his easy chair reading one of the thousands of books in his possession. His world was centered around philosophy and his strong faith as a Catholic. He never compromised his principles, and his word was his bond. But mostly, he liked to laugh and make others laugh. He will be sorely missed for years to come, but he will continue to live in our hearts for much longer.
