At an early age she learned to play the piano and she loved music throughout her life. When her children misbehaved she would sing church songs to them. Helen loved to garden, and took great pride in her vegetables and flowers. It was a treat for her children to "graze" on strawberries and peas in the garden. Her favorite flower was the rose because it reminded her of her mother, who died when Helen was just ten years old. She stayed active into her later years at Life Care by embroidering, nurturing her flower garden, playing the piano, attending senior aerobics, playing cards, reading, and visiting with friends and relatives.

There were sad days when Helen was preceded in death in June 2013 by her oldest child, Richard of Overland Park, KS; the death of her youngest son, Danny in September 2018; and by her oldest grandson Timothy (son of Larry) who passed at birth in July 1968.
