(KLZA) Food prices in Nebraska increased about 2.5 percent during 2012. USDA Economist Ricky Volpe says due to the summer drought he is predicting a 3 to 4% increase in food prices for 2013. (play audio :25 seconds)

As a result of the drought livestock feed prices saw a dramatic increase in 2012. Volpe says that will mean we will pay more for meat and other animal based products in 2013. (play audio :09 seconds)
