BC Alumnus Wins Samuelson Award (KAIR) -- A Benedictine College grad has won a national award for writing.

Dr. Sylvester J. Schieber, a 1968 graduate of St. Benedict's College, now Benedictine College, was honored with the 17th annual TIAA-CREF Paul A. Samuelson Award for Outstanding Scholarly Writing on Lifelong Financial Security.

The award, announced on January 4th in San Diego at the Allied Social Science Association's annual meeting, is named after Nobel Prize winner Paul A. Samuelson in honor of his achievements in the field of economics.
