In Tecumseh, the Johnson County Central Public School will sponsor the Summer Food Service Program at the school at 358 North 6th Street. The hours for meals at the school in Tecumseh will be from 11 a-m until 12:30 p-m.

This year The Summer Food Service Program, which is one of the USDA's Child Nutrition Program is expected to provide more than 200-million meals to children. In Nebraska there are more than 60 sponsors and almost 270 sites across the state to help ensure children have nutritious meals throughout the summer months.
