A tour of the farm is scheduled followed by lunch courtesy of Conestoga Energy Partners.

T&O Farms is one of three Water Technology Farms that were created recently in response to public input and identified in the *Long-Term Vision for the Future of Water Supply in Kansas*. It is located 15 miles south of Garden City on Highway 83, west on T.V. Road, then south on Stone Road.
