Northwest's School of Agricultural Sciences is experiencing rapid growth with more than 12 percent of the University's undergraduate population enrolled in an agriculture major. The School relocated this fall to the Dean L. Hubbard for Innovation while facilities such as the Horticulture Complex and the 448-acre R.T. Wright Farm – a which is home to beef, swine, dairy and sheep enterprises as well as row and forage crops – continue to provide students with hands-on, profession-based experience and supports the 95 percent of bachelor's degree earners in the School who find employment or continue their education within six months of graduation.

Additionally, Northwest and the School of Agricultural Sciences are in the planning stages and pursuing private support to help fund an \$8.5 million,

29,000-square-foot Agricultural Learning Center at the Wright Farm and supplement and enhance the academic curriculum.

The School of Agricultural Sciences offers agricultural majors in agricultural business, agriculture education, agriculture science, agronomy, animal science, animal science-pre vet, horticulture and technology, in addition to minors, a two-year farm operations certificate and master's programs in agriculture, education and economics.
