Daniel B. Holthaus, 81, of Marysville, formerly of Axtell, Kansas died at his home in Marysville, Kansas.

A former member of St. Michael's Church in Axtell and of Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church in Kansas City, where he volunteered at the food bank. He was a life member of the American Legion Post #1000 at Jefferson City, Missouri, a member of the Air Force Sergeants Association, the Air Force Association, and an associate member of the Letter Carriers' Union Branch #30. He is survived by several cousins. He was preceded in death by his mother on June 15, 1999 and his father on October 27, 2004.
