Yola Bee Strobel, 87, of Hiawatha, passed away July 29, 2015.

Yola Bee (Brown) Strobel was born on May 26, 1928, in Shubert, Nebraska, to George Dewey and Edna Brown. The family moved to Falls City, Nebraska, in 1942. Bee graduated from Falls City High School in 1946. After attending Gard Business School in St. Joseph, Missouri, she worked at the Missouri Pacific Railroad offices in Falls City.
