Becky Jo McFeeters, 60, of Hiawatha, died unexpectedly Monday evening, January 15, 2018, at her home.

She was born February 6, 1957, at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, one of five children born to John and Dora Bartholemew McKee. Becky grew up at Cedar Rapids prior to moving with her family as a teenager to Missouri. Becky worked hard to complete requirements for her GED.
