

Falls City Arboretum Anniversary Celebrated on Arbor Day

Cool and cloudy weather conditions didn't deter Falls City's Arbor Day celebration Sunday afternoon.

The centerpiece of the program was a celebration of the 20th anniversary of the first plantings at the Itha Krumme Memorial Arboretum. Folks who came to the arboretum Sunday afternoon enjoyed a program with music by the Clefsmen and the Falls City Brass Ensemble.
