Commission Urged Not to Destroy Old Jail

Commissioner Steve Roberts jumped up out of his chair to address Tollefson, saying he was decorating his father's grave on that day and couldn't attend.

County Clerk Debbie Parker said she also took offense, saying she was decorating family graves out of state.
