Derek Nold and Zach Halter provided the most punch with the bat for Doniphan County on the evening each belting a two-run home run. Halter, also earned himself the pitching win, after coming in, in relief for Derek Nold. Cody Bennett finished off the game for Doniphan County, pitching the final two innings for the save.

Doniphan County improved to 3-6 (2-2 league) on the season with the win, while Holton moved to 3-3 (2-1 league).
