Friday July 13th:

Sabetha Downs Auburn in a Non-League Matchup

Sabetha defeated Auburn Friday night 11-3. Sabetha's 11 hit attack backed Benji Stoller's 5-inning complete game performance. Stoller allowed only three hits and walked and hit a batter during the contest to earn his sixth win of the season. Graham Droge collected three hits and three RBI's to lead the offense. Nolan Keim & Thaine Allen each added a pair of hits. Riley Wells and Allen had two RBI's. Sabetha scored multiple runs in four of the five innings.

Atchison Uses Big Fourth to get Pass Holton

Doniphan County took down Auburn 2-1 in walk-off fashion with the game winning walk-off hit coming by Zach Halter in the seventh after an Auburn error. Derek Nold pitched the complete game only giving up one-hit with eight strikeout's and giving up an unearned run.

Marysville Swept Hiawatha in a Non-League Double-Header

Hiawatha on Saturday was swept by Marysville in a non-league double-header, 7-3 and 14-2. Game one, Marysville got on the board early with two in the first; Hiawatha would tie the game in the bottom of the third, but Marysville would go on to score three in the fifth and a few more while Hiawatha would only add one, falling 7-3. Schmelzle pitched the complete game for Marysville, while Fisher went 3-4 with two RBI. Tyler Jacobsen was the only Hiawatha player to have a multi-hit game going 3-4 with two RBI in the loss.
