Southeast Nebraska No-Till Meeting Scheduled

(KLZA)-- How to capture your full potential with soil carbon is a main theme for the Southeast Nebraska Soil Health and No-Till Conference coming up Monday, February 22nd.

The conference will be held at the Hallam Community Center beginning with an 8 a-m registration. The program starts at 8:30 a-m and will conclude at 3:30 p-m. The registration is free and a noon meal is included.

Several out-of-state experts will be on hand. Jerry Hatfield, soils scientist from USDA-ARS in Des Moines, Iowa will discuss Soil Health, Capturing the Full Potential of No-Till.

Josh Lloyd, a Kansas farmer with an integrated livestock and crop farm will discuss yield mapping and cover crops.

UNL Ag Engineer Paul Jasa will discuss the importance of a systems approach to no-till farming and update new cover crop date.

New computer tools available for farmers and ephemeral erosion will also be discussed.
